RENAISSANCE®

Parent's Guide to Accelerated Reader

What is Renaissance Accelerated Reader (AR)?

AR is a reading program that helps teachers support and monitor children's reading practice. Your child picks a book at their own level and reads it at their own pace. When finished, your child takes a short online quiz to measure how much of the book they understood.



What is a Renaissance Star Reading test?

Star Reading is an online test used to measure your child's reading level. The test uses multiple-choice questions and takes around 20 minutes.

How do students select books?

AR includes over 30,000 books. These can be found in the school library as well as public libraries, books shops, homes, etc. Each book is assigned three scores to help your child make a suitable choice:

I am currently in the process of visiting our feeder schools, liaising with them as regards our groupings for tutor groups, awaiting relevant data on each child and putting together the programme for our Transition Days on 5^{th} , 6^{th} & 7^{th} July. Over these three days there will be a range of subjects for all children to experience, and I will let you know more information in the next month's bulletin. Our aim is for your child to come away feeling as though they:

- ** know the layout of the school
- ** meet their tutor group
- ** have met some of the key members of staff who they will be working with on a daily basis.

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** know what a lesson will feel like. We will have taster sessions of some lessons to give your child a feel of what a secondary classroom looks like, how a session runs and how timings will work

** know what lunchtimes will feel like with an opportunity to appreciate and experience the canteen

After half term, several of our current students and I will be visiting the Year 6s in our local schools. This is an opportunity for your child to have really honest and open conversations about any concerns that they are having. These are often about really practical things like: where the toilets, who can I speak to if I'm worried, what happens if I get lost, how much homework will I get?!

School Uniform

PE Kit/clothing for Testwood

The expectation is that all pupils will have a PE (House) shirt, black shorts, trainers (appropriate footwear-i.e. football boots for use on the field) for their lessons. From November-February half- term pupils are encouraged and should be either wearing the school PE fleece or a school games (rugby) shirt over their PE top. Black Testwood tracksuit bottoms (or plain black) are also allowed. More recently (base layers), training under garments can also be used (black) to keep warm and to ensure are pupils are looking part of a team.
