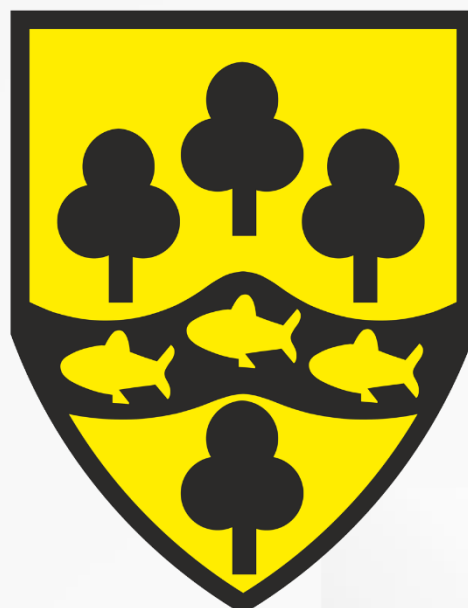

What are you going to do in Design and Technology? You will learn a wide range of skills across three subject areas:

Food- you will know how to follow recipes, use a range of equipment and take-home delicious dishes.

Textiles- you will learn about fabrics, safe use of equipment, hand and machine skills and how to develop a design in fabric.

Product Design- you will research, develop and produce your own design in materials such as wood and plastic.

Computer Aided Design - Students will be taught how to use cloud-based modeling software to design a simple product. They will then get the opportunity to 3D print and test their design.

You can bring in your own apron during Food and Product Design lessons. A monetary contribution will be asked for so that you can bring your projects home.

How can you prepare for September?

- Help make and prepare your favourite dish for dinner for you and your family.
- Explain how to sew a button onto a clothing garment
- Design and create a homemade car that is powered by a balloon.

What will you study in the first half term?

Health and Safety of the Technology environment. How to prepare ingredients and cook/bake recipes. Develop skills of hand-sewing and machine sewing before developing and making a design.

What are you going to do in Drama?

What are you going to do in English?

In English lessons at Testwood you will read a variety of fiction and non-fiction texts; you will explore how writers engage readers through their choice of style and techniques. You will consider the purpose of different texts and focus on persuasion, as well as informative writing. Speaking and listening is an important part of your English journey and you will have the chance to practice presenting your ideas verbally in class through discussions and individual performances.

Writing is a key area of English and you will be asked to show off your creative writing skills through forms such as stories, poems and letters.

We have lots of exciting units of work in Year 7 including: Villains in Literature and Film, Shakespeare's Outsides, Novel study of 'The Island at the End of Everything', Gothic Story Writing and Narrative Poetry.

How can you prepare for September?

You can prepare for September by reading lots of novels, non-fiction texts or listening to audio books. There is a link below that will allow you to listen to the first Harry Potter story. You could practise your writing skills over the summer by keeping a notebook handy and perhaps writing some interesting descriptions of things you see whilst out and about. See if you can use any of the techniques your primary school teachers taught you, to make your writing come to life. We would love to see anything you write over the summer, so keep it safe ready for September.

What will you study in the first half term?

We start Year 7 with looking at Villains in Literature and Film where we explore a multitude of famous Villains from Cruella De Ville to Lord Voldemort.

Reading is incredibly important at Testwood, as it was at your primary school, and you will have regular reading lessons in the library.

We start by spending several weeks taking a virtual tour to some 'Fantastic Places' around the world, including Rio de Janeiro, the River Granges and the Amazon Rainforest.

What are you going to do in History?

At Testwood you will study history from all around the world and see how historians investigate the past. You will look at the causes of significant events in our history and how the world has changed.

How can you prepare for September?

Have a look at the websites below. The English Heritage has a great section on the Battle of Hastings. You could also find out about one of the Norman sites in England, including great castles and magnificent abbeys. You could visit SeaCity museum and find out about how Southampton has changed over time. Who lived in Southampton? What can archaeology tell us about their lives?

What will you study in the first half term?

You will start the first term looking at Islamic Empire, the Silk Roads and the city of Baghdad. We will move onto look at the Saxons, the tribes from Germany, Denmark and the Netherlands that settled in England in the 5th century. Finally, we will investigate 1066, a momentous year for English. You will study the Battle of Hastings and the consequences of the Norman Conquest.

What are you going to do in Maths?

In Maths you will follow a scheme of work which encourages fluency at core skills, develops critical thinking in problem solving and grows your communication levels so that you are able to demonstrate what you have understood to each other.

How can you prepare for September?

The core skills you have learnt in numeracy will still be needed at Testwood. Please continue to practice your times tables, especially those 7s and 8s. Continue to problem solve, thinking of methods and steps to find solutions. Can you explain how you have solved a mathematical problem to someone else?

What you will study in the first half term?

In September you will have the chance to;

- study core skills of numeracy building upon and building up those learnt skills from Junior School.
- Start to study algebra looking at all types of sequences, substitution and using function machines.

What are you going to learn in French?

French is the first language for millions of people around the world and it is spoken as a second language by millions more! What are you going to do in Music?

What are you going to do in PER? At Testwood you will study religions from all around the world, such as the major world religions, as well as non-religious worldviews, like Humanism. This subject is for everyone, whatever your beliefs are. You'll find out what people believe, how they worship and how their beliefs influence their lives. It's not just about learning facts, it's about thinking deeply, being curious and considering different viewpoints. It's a subject that helps you understand the world, respect others and make sense of your own values

How can you prepare for September?

Have a look at the websites below. BBC Bitesize has lots of great information about world views. You could also check out the excellent My Life, My Religion videos on YouTube. In Year 7, the religions we focus on are Judaism and Christianity.

What will you study in the first half term?

In your first term we will be looking at a story called 'The Island', about a cruise ship which crash-lands on a mysterious island. Will the passengers work together to survive? In this topic you will be thinking about why community is important, and why we celebrate events such as the birth of a baby, or a wedding.

What are you going to do in Physical Education? You will learn skills, techniques and tactics in a range of sports including Netball, Hockey, Rugby and Football, alongside creative activities such as Dance and Gymnastics. Athletics, Rounders' and Cricket will also take place during the summer term.

How can you prepare for September?

Improve your stamina by walking, jogging or cycling for more than 30 minutes every day. Develop your coordination by throwing and catching regularly.

What will you study in the first half term?

You will be developing your Core Skills required to support success within physical activity. A Cross-Country challenge will occur in Term 1 before moving on to traditional sporting activities.

Uniform

Purchase from Skoolkit; House colour Polo-Shirt and black shorts/skort, with trainers and moulded boots. Also, it is recommended to purchase a fleece jumper and tracksuit bottoms, both with Testwood logo. Leggings are not part of the year 7 PE uniform. Hair is expected to be tied up and jewellery removed every lesson. PE kit is expected to be worn every lesson, even if excused.

What are you going to do in Science?

Scientists need a wide variety of skills: amongst the most important of these are Observation (watching carefully), Investigating, Measuring and Explaining. We will be using all of these skills to investigate everyday things and explain them.

We will consider questions such as:

How do chemicals react? What is electricity?

We will be designing experiments that we can use to work out the answers to these questions and lots of other questions besides these too!

How can you prepare for September?

To prepare for September keep these skills going over the summer by doing the following:

1. Try experiments at home (with your parents' and carers permission). There are lots of simple experiments on the internet. Record your results and really try to work out what it means.
2. Watch scientific programmes by great presenters like David Attenborough, Dr Alice Roberts, Prof Jim Alkalili, Prof Maggie Aderin-Popcock, Prof Brian Cox.
3. Watch Youtubers like Bill Nye Science Guy or Veritasium.

What will you study in the first half term?

In the first half term you will be studying some of these topics:

Forces - this is all about the effects of forces on objects

Energy - how is energy transferred and where does it go?

Matter - what is everything made of?

Cells - what are living things made of?

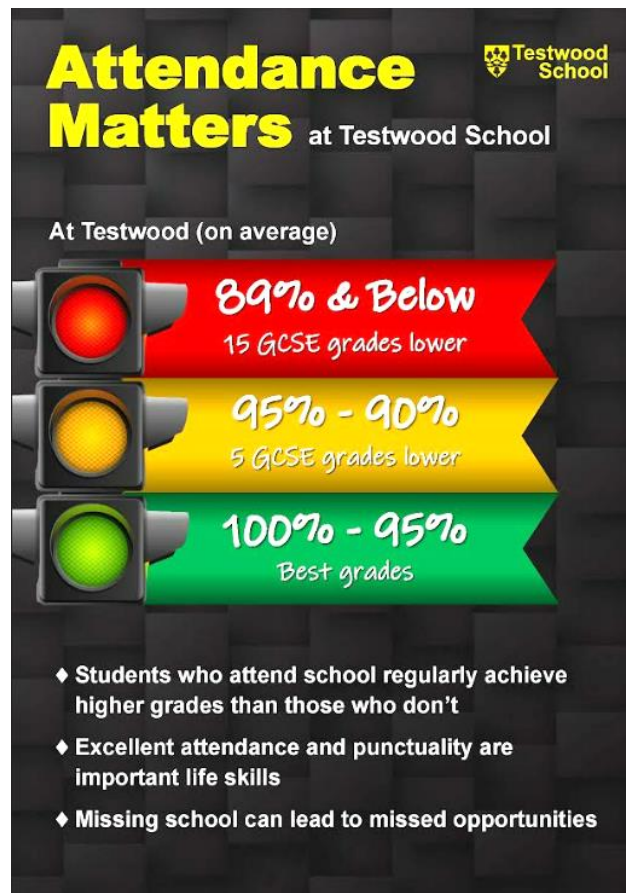
Attendance

Uniform



School Blazer

Plain black with School badge on top pocket. Compulsory until May half-term and then optional for the final half-term.



School Tie

School ties in house colours must be worn and are obtainable from Skoolkit. At least six stripes should be showing. Prefect ties must show the Testwood School logo.



Shirt/Blouse

Plain white and buttoned to the neck with a plain collar. Please note: on formal occasions long sleeves are necessary.



Skirts

Plain black pleated 24" knee length skirt. Short and/or tight skirts are not acceptable for School. Fashion, wrap-over or long skirts are not appropriate. Denim or cord are not allowed.



Trousers

Plain black tailored School trousers. (Fashion trousers, e.g. very tight trousers are not acceptable). Denim or cord are not allowed. Leggings are not allowed.



Shorts

Plain black or grey tailored school shorts are an option all-year round.



Jumper

Plain black with Testwood badge. Optional to wear underneath blazer, NOT instead of blazer



Shoes

Totally black footwear which must fasten securely for safety. No other colours on the footwear and no air bubbles are permitted. No footwear above the ankle e.g. no ankle boots or higher, must be traditional shoe height. Low heels must be worn. Suitable footwear should be worn in snowy conditions.



Socks

In plain colours only: white, grey or black socks or black tights should be worn. Socks are not to be patterned.



Outdoor Coat

Smart, plain dark coloured, preferably black without badges. Denim, leather jackets and hoodies are not acceptable.



Jewellery/Badges

A watch, one plain stud earring in either or each ear lobe and School badges are the only acceptable additions to the School uniform. It may be necessary to remove items of jewellery in some practical lessons. Facial/body piercing is not acceptable for School. Stretchers, hoops, retainers, mouth smileys or tongue studs are not allowed.



Make-up

Year 7, 8 and 9 students are not allowed to wear make-up. Year 10 and 11 may wear natural looking subtle make-up, but this should be only discreet mascara and/or foundation. No nail varnish, false nails or extensions allowed. Hand paint or henna is not allowed. Nor lip stick or lip gloss.



Hairstyles

The school reserves the right to make a judgement on whether a student's hairstyle, hair colour or headwear is inappropriate for the school environment; however, the school will ensure that any such judgements do not discriminate against any student. Students with long hair must ensure that this does not impede their vision, cover their face, or cause a health and safety risk. Long hair must be tied up during practical lessons (e.g. during PE).

The following hairstyles, hair colours and headwear are not considered appropriate for school:

- * Brightly coloured dyed hair
- * Excessive hair accessories
- * Excessive tramlines in the back or side of the head

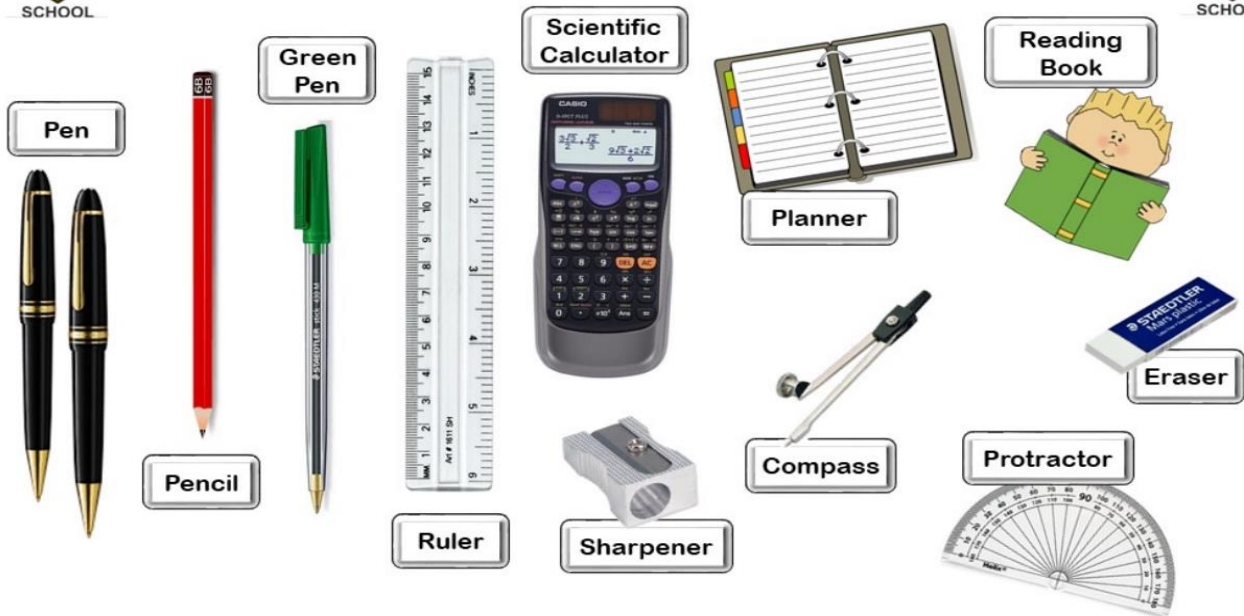

Rewards and Sanctions

Be Ready, Be Respectful, Be Responsible

Students are rewarded regularly at Testwood School for a wide range of reasons, which may include:

- Excellent contributions to lessons
- Completing a good piece of work in class
- Completing an outstanding piece of homework
- Contributions to extra-curricular
- Being helpful to staff or peers

This could be in the form of:

- Achievement points

Students will receive a sanction if they are not following the school rules, which may include:

- Not completing sufficient classwork or homework
- Being involved in disruptive or unsafe behaviour

This could be in the form of:

- Phone call or letter home
- Repair time
- In serious cases, internal or external exclusion
